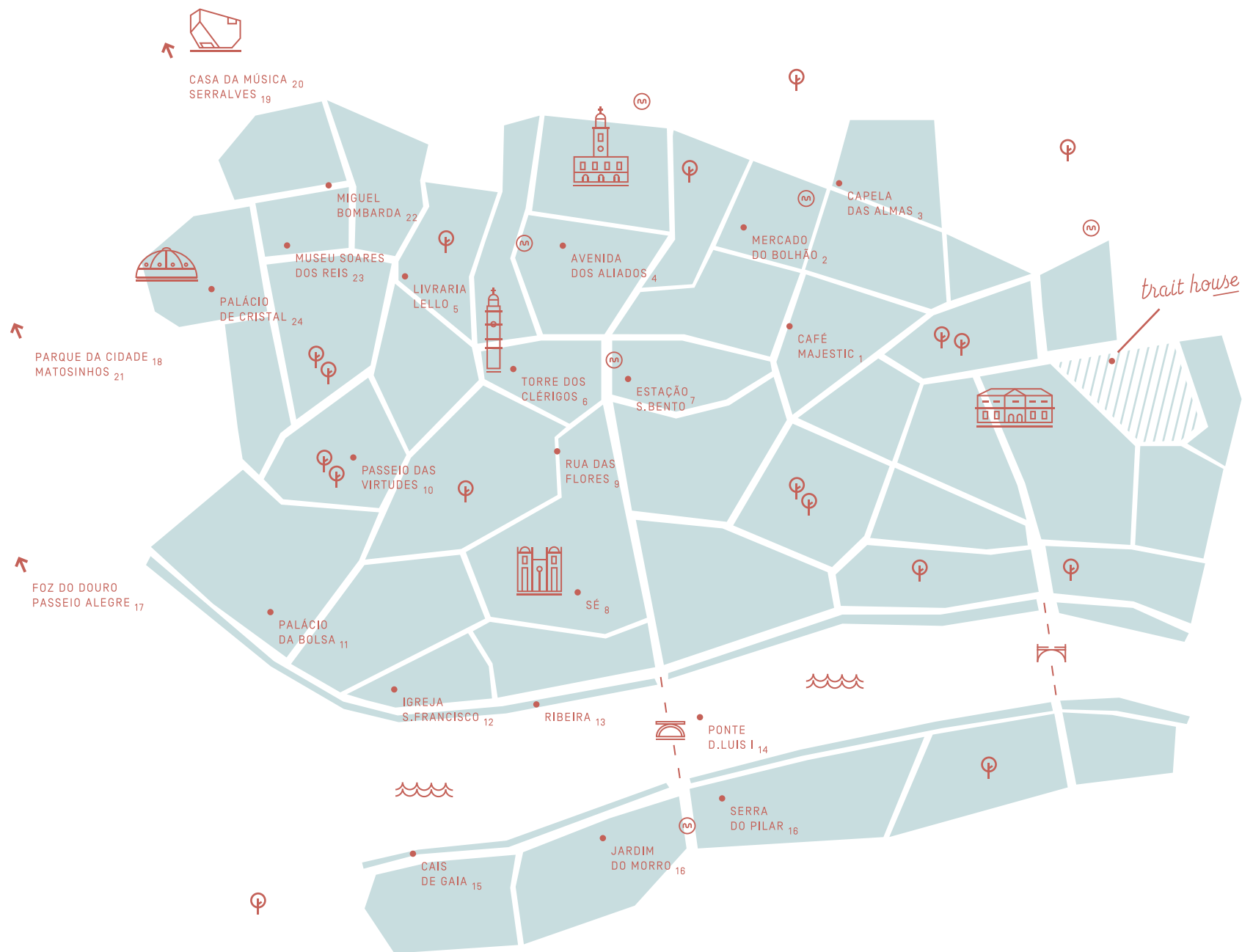

### OLD TOWN

**CAFÉ MAJESTIC** <sup>1</sup>  
A famous old Porto landmark decorated in Art Nouveau style.

**MERCADO DO BOLHÃO** <sup>2</sup>  
Porto's most iconic market and a great place to pick up fresh food.

**CAPELA DAS ALMAS** <sup>3</sup>  
Covered in painted blue tiles, this unique chapel is nestled in the heart of the city.

**AVENIDA DOS ALIADOS** <sup>4</sup>  
Bisecting the city from east to west, Porto's most important boulevard is perfect for a leisurely stroll.

**LIVRARIA LELLO** <sup>5</sup>  
One of the world's most beautiful bookshops, Lello is home to a magnificent curved wooden staircase.

**TORRE DOS CLÉRIGOS** <sup>6</sup>  
This Baroque tower offers amazing views over the city for those who climb its 240 steps.

**ESTAÇÃO DE S. BENTO** <sup>7</sup>  
This train station whisks you back to the golden age of rail travel. It's famous for its huge 'azulejo' tiles that depict scenes from Portugal's history.

**SÉ CATEDRAL** <sup>8</sup>  
One of the city's oldest monuments. Originally built in the 12th century, this impressive Romanesque cathedral has elegant Gothic cloisters.

**RUA DAS FLORES** <sup>9</sup>  
A picturesque pedestrian street with a range of local shops and restaurants.

**PASSEIO DAS VIRTUDES** <sup>10</sup>  
This hidden hillside garden is full of charming spots to sit and gaze over the River Douro. There's always a gentle buzz of activity as young people who come to chat and enjoy the sunset. In spring and summer, the garden hosts outdoor concerts.

**PALÁCIO DA BOLSA** <sup>11</sup>  
A splendid Neoclassical monument that houses a lavish ballroom known as Salão Árabe (Arabian Hall).

**IGREJA DE S. FRANCISCO** <sup>12</sup>  
Impressive church built in the 14th century with a magnificent interior and an interesting blend of architectural styles.

**RIBEIRA** <sup>13</sup>  
With its colourful house fronts and quaint balconies, this riverfront promenade is picture-postcard Porto. Lined with local eateries, it's a great place to sip a drink while enjoying the views across to Gaia.

**PONTE D. LUIS** <sup>14</sup>  
One of Porto's most iconic landmarks, this bridge was designed by one of Gustave Eiffel's disciples. Towering over the River Douro, its pedestrian walkways offer unbeatable city views.

**CAIS DE GAIA** <sup>15</sup>  
The views from here are perhaps the longest-lasting images of Porto for visitors. It is where Port wine is stored and aged, and a visit to any of the warehouses should not be missed.

**JARDIM DO MORRO - SERRA DO PILAR** <sup>16</sup>  
This hilltop park has great panoramic views of its surroundings. From here, Porto is reduced to postcard format.

### FOZ - BOAVISTA - MATOSINHOS

**PASSEIO ALEGRE** <sup>17</sup>  
Tram line 1 runs from Porto's Old Town to the garden of Passeio Alegre, along the banks of the River Douro.

**PARQUE DA CIDADE** <sup>18</sup>  
A tranquil oasis away from the buzz of the city, this expanse of lawns and lakes is Portugal's biggest city park.

**SERRALVES** <sup>19</sup>  
This cultural institution combines a contemporary art museum, an Art Deco villa and extensive gardens.

**CASA DA MÚSICA** <sup>20</sup>  
This unusual-shaped building is the beating heart of Porto's cultural scene and the home of the Porto National Orchestra.

**MATOSINHOS** <sup>21</sup>  
A long-time source of the city's seafood, this charming seaside town is now best known for its surf-friendly waves.

### ART DISTRICT

**GALERIAS MIGUEL BOMBARDA** <sup>22</sup>  
Lined with galleries, this street is at the centre of a growing art district.

**MUSEU SOARES DOS REIS** <sup>23</sup>  
This art museum has an impressive collection, ranging from Neolithic carvings to more recent pieces from Portugal's Modernist movement.

**PALÁCIO CRISTAL** <sup>24</sup>  
Sat on a hilltop overlooking the River Douro, this beautiful botanical garden is one of Porto's best-loved spots. It's a maze of peaceful little gardens full of lush plant life and amazing views.
